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### Casa dei Bambini, Preschool & Kindergarten

March was a wonderful month for our Casa children. They enjoyed the opportunity to show off their learning during Celebration of Learning. They have worked hard and shown a lot of growth this year. Their teachers are very proud of the work that they have done.

This month we will investigate signs of spring. Students will observe and record changes that happen as it goes from winter to spring. Hopefully the weather will be nice enough for us to do some outdoor learning!

In Math, we will focus on 2D and 3D shapes. We will look for shapes in nature and describe what we see. We will also investigate 3D shapes through hands-on experiences.

In Language, we will be focusing on Phonemic Awareness and Concepts of Print. Phonemic Awareness is the ability to focus on and manipulate individual sounds in words. As a group we will practice rhyming, blending words, isolating beginning, and ending sounds, and segmenting words. Concepts of Print is the understanding of how printed language works. The concepts we will focus on are:

- The front and back of a book
- Words are made up of letters
- Print is read from left to right and top to bottom
- One print word represents one spoken word when read aloud
- Every word has a first and last letter
- Every sentence has a first and last word

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# Lower Elementary, Gr. 1, 2, 3


Hello, Parkside families!

The month of March flew by with lots to celebrate. Our students planned and built Rube Goldberg simple machines which brought lots of excitement to our classrooms! This month, we received our Language Arts blending boards which has helped us with sounding out and spelling words using the word rules we know. The end of March brought our second Celebration of Learning. It was amazing to be a part of our student-led celebrations and to have you, the families, in to see all the progress we have made! We also sat in on some wonderful school wide-events including Earth Rangers and the Alberta Musical Theatre Company.

With Spring, comes our Needs of Plants and Animals unit in Science. Across our five ELMO123 classes, students will be busy planting and caring for different types of plants and will be investigating and researching the life cycles of different animals. More specific information will be coming your way from your child's teacher. In Language Arts, students are learning how to write simple paragraphs using knowledge from different subject areas. In Math, we are creating and solving word problems in addition to learning about Time and Measurement. In Social Studies, students continue to investigate the different continents, with focus on the following countries: India, Tunisia, Ukraine and Peru. Ask your child about what they might be able to share with you at home!

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# Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Welcome Spring!

March was a month filled with perseverance and connection! Students worked so hard at creating and sharing items from Term 2 Celebration of Learning nights! Thank you to all parents and families that were able to attend, it means so much to us to have you in our classrooms supporting your child's successes!

In Math, we have been focusing on geometry. Students are working on identifying, reflecting, translating and rotating 2D and 3D shapes on a coordinate grid. We have been able to connect a lot of Art through concepts like Tessellations and discussing shapes within our recent sculptures! There have been some very engaging presentations of Montessori materials such as the Geometry Cabinet, Geometric Blue Solids and Geometric Sticks to show lines and angles.

In Language, we have been able to be inspired by a recent Alberta Musical Theatre Company live performance and are including writing of interactive speeches, readers theatre and passion projects into our writing repertoire this month. Other writing topics of letters, narratives and opinion-based prompts continue to be favourites of our students. As students explore recorders and ukuleles in Music there are many opportunities for their Language work to cross into song writing and other real-world applications of the written word!

Grade 4 students finished up our Science unit on light and shadow and are now starting on building things with a focus on various wheels, levers, and other simple machines! In Social Studies, Grade 4 students are learning about the history of Alberta, the land, the peoples and how it was settled. Grade 5 students are creating weather reports on a

topic of their choice, with presentations ranging from rainbows to tornadoes to the water cycle and everything in between! For Social Studies, we were inspired by our work on our mini libraries and did a novel study called the "Murder on the Canadian" a mysterious adventure set on the trans-Canada railway. Students voted and we will explore one more mystery written by Canadian author Eric Wilson that is set in the West Edmonton Mall! Grade 6 students continued their physics work learning all about reversible and irreversible changes in Science. For Social Studies, they have been discussing the ins and outs of provincial politics. Students will soon be creating their own party complete with compelling campaigns!
