

Happy New Year!

December was another month that flew by! It was a time filled with many activities, celebrations, and learning. Casa students got to show their wonderful singing skills off to everyone at the Christmas concert, learn about different holiday celebrations around the world, and make holiday crafts. On December 22nd we said farewell to Miss Sonja who has done a great job as our Casa 1 teacher for the first part of this year. We welcome back Miss Trisha on January 9th from her maternity leave.

As everyone returns from the holiday break, we will be reviewing all the routines and classroom expectations. This type of review is always done after an extended break to help students and staff get back into the normalized state to be ready to learn.

January is going to be spent exploring different animals and how they survive the winter. Through stories, games, and activities, the children will learn about hibernation, migration, and different ways animals can adapt to meet their basic needs in winter. We are also hoping that we have winter weather in the New Year that allows us to be outside lots!

It is sure to be another fun month spent in our Casa dei Bambini!



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Lower Elementary, Gr. 1, 2, 3

We hope that everyone had a fun and restful winter break. We are excited to be back together and continue our learning adventures in 2023!

December was full of fun and exciting learning opportunities. It was great to be able to get together for Celebration of Learning! In December we were learning about the many ways in which people from around the world celebrate different holidays through discussions and hands-on activities. We enjoyed performing at the Christmas concerts and experienced a school-wide Brunch for Lunch meal at school!

Our Lower Elementary classes continue our exploration into the Montessori Cosmic curriculum by sharing The Third Great Lesson: How Human's Came to Earth. Through this story the students will learn about how humans have changed over time and the common needs of people.

In Science, we have examined patterns in nature (seasons, day/night) and we were able to celebrate the Winter Solstice on December 21st. We also deepened our understanding of animal changes from fall to winter and we will continue exploring animal classification. We will start our learning on the topics of Energy and Matter through hands-on building activities such as marble race games. Classroom teachers may reach out to ask for recyclables to be sent in to support the learning in this unit.

In Social Studies, each class is taking turns learning about different continents and countries around the world. Through these units, students will explore geography, landforms, food, clothing, religion, animals, and culture. These units will provide everyone with a variety of handson art and practical life activities to demonstrate their understanding. Students will also deepen their understanding while completing Montessori Nomenclature activities about their country.

We will be monitoring the weather daily and attempting to get outside as much as possible for recess. Please ensure that your child is dressed in layers for the weather. Having outdoor gear (gloves, mittens, hats, and more) labeled will help us in returning them to their owners if they are dropped outside, in the boot room, or hallway.

We are looking forward to another exciting month of learning! Look out for more information coming your way regarding Literacy Week at the end of January!

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Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Greetings from Upper ELMO!

Greetings and a Happy New Year from the Upper ELMO team. It's amazing how fast the first four months of school flew by. The students have been so excited to see the return of many beloved events and the start of new traditions. December was very busy with Christmas concerts, caroling, winter celebrations around the world and our first ever Brunch for Lunch!

In December, students worked on many Practical Life activities and crafting projects that included making pompoms, sewing, and painting.

In Math, we focused on patterns and sequences. Students learned about the Fibonacci sequence as well as arithmetic and geometric patterns. Students were able to use the Montessori Algebraic Pegboard to investigate patterns. They have been using Xtra math to practice basic facts. Daily basic fact practice builds fluency which helps students with problem solving and higher-level skills. We continue to practice multiplication and division and to use our specialized Montessori materials.

Language continues to be a favourite area of the classroom for many students as we loop through many different concepts. We used themes of winter celebrations around the world, and winter to demonstrate the ability to listen, view, respond and create. Students loved creating special "Poettrees" using many different figurative language concepts.

In Science grade sixes have been learning about the solar system and were finally able to complete their Crime Scene Investigation. The grade fives have started Chemistry with hands on experiments that explore the States of Matter. Some of the grade four students were able to bring their plants home, it was amazing to see how well they grew in the classroom. They have started working on the "Waste in Our World" unit.

In Social Studies, grade sixes are working on a research project about ancient Athens in preparation for a Greek cultural fair in the new year. Grade fives have started sharing stories of the history of Canada. Students are actively listening to indigenous tales and retelling them in their own series of mini books. This will continue throughout term two. Grade four students have been busy researching

the physical regions of Alberta and creating their own Montessori classroom materials that can be shared with their peers. Examples of this include nomenclature cards, research cards and puzzles.

Looking forward to January, we will be spending time reviewing the expectations and setting individual learning goals. This tends to be a time of great growth for all the students. We can't wait to see what learning in 2023 brings!


