

Happy Fall and Welcome to October!

It has been a lovely month of getting to know

one another and in developing our daily expectations and routines. The children are learning important Montessori practices such as how to use and roll up a mat, how to properly care for the materials and put them back on the shelves, and how to treat one another with grace and courtesy in the classroom. The Casa dei Bambini classes have been enjoying the beautiful weather of the season and have been bringing elements of autumn into our classrooms as we delved into explorations of leaves and pumpkins during September. Casa students enjoyed carefully washing pumpkins, sorting pumpkins by colour and size, collecting leaves, tracing leaves, and making imprint art in clay with their unique textures.

We also spent time learning about the Zones of Regulation and practicing identifying and naming how we feel. Recognizing and saying how you feel is an important part of self-regulation, and Casa students have been making great strides.

In October we will be adding to our self-regulation took kit by learning some new breathing techniques and practicing mindfulness. We are also looking forward to our sunflower study this month. We hope to use all of our senses in this exciting theme. We plan to create beautiful sunflower art, investigate the parts of the sunflower, and even make use of the seeds for counting and in preparing delicious snacks!

Fall is a great time to get in the kitchen, and we're looking forward to spending time in our Practical Life room to bake, prepare food together and connect with each other in this special way. As the weather begins to get colder, please remember to help your child come to school each day dressed to be outdoors. Layers are great this time of year!

It's been a great beginning to the school year and the Montessori normalization process is well underway in our classrooms! Our students are doing a wonderful job learning the routines and expectations in each classroom and our Grade One students are adjusting to full days of school. We are working on building and strengthening the relationships we have with each other and on learning to work as a team. Each day we see evidence of students supporting each other with love and kindness and we are so proud of them.

The days are becoming a bit chilly now. The students are enjoying our new playground and we are taking advantage of opportunities to be outside before the snow arrives. This past month we have been digging into the Montessori Great Lessons. These lessons give students an overall impression of the grand topics of the universe, the earth, and life on earth. They form the heart of the Montessori elementary curriculum. The Five Great Lessons span about 15 billion years! This month the students have been exploring the formation of the universe, stars, and solar system, with a focus on the earth's early development.

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Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Hello from Upper ELMO!

Normalization, or becoming independent of the routines and expectations of our classrooms, has been the primary focus as we start the year together! The 456 classes have been working very hard at making connections and welcoming in the new Grade 4 students as they navigate the Upper ELMO world for the first time. It is so special to have all three 456 classrooms in the same hall – as well as Miss Rebecca and Miss Angie, our Montessori EAs. There are unlimited possibilities for collaboration across our three grade levels and three homerooms!

In Language, we have been looping various forms of writing throughout the week and will continue this all year instead of doing separate "units" of writing. Last year we found that students enjoyed that they were able to build on their writing skills in all areas throughout the year and found specific types of writing to be their favourite - whether it was poetry, letter-writing, narratives, or functional writing tasks, we are excited to see what our authors create this year! Students will go through the writing process of plan, draft, revise, edit and publish many times this year and have already given pieces of their writing to their teachers so that we can guide our instruction! Students will also be able to get back into our school library this month as guided reading groups or individual novel studies are beginning.

In Math, we have started the year with a review of place value and strategies for the four operations; addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. This work will continue all year as students move from using concrete Montessori materials to more abstract pencil and paper algorithms. Coming up in October we will expand student knowledge of number as they connect the decimal place value system to fractions and ratios, depending on their grade level. Our Grade 4 students have been exploring the clock and telling time, be sure to quiz them and practice in your morning and evening routines.

For French, students are learning the basics. From numbers, colours, greetings and calendar - les élèves vont très bien! (The students are doing well!). In Art, the theme has been drawing and soon we will explore other mediums such as watercolour or

oil pastel. Music has focused on beat and rhythm; students will soon explore notation as they prepare for instrument work later this year! One of our favourite songs we have learnt so far is "Donna Nobis Pacem" a song in Latin for peace.

This year for Science and Social Studies each 456 teacher is responsible for a specific grade level and will plan cross-curricular projects with their group! Miss Jackie has been working with the Grade 4s on mapping Alberta and waste in our world. Miss Stefanie has been working with the Grade 5s on the regions of Canada and matter. Miss Desiree has been working with the Grade 6s on Ancient Greece democracy and the scientific method.

It has been a wonderful start to the year, and we are looking forward to some Halloween or Fall-themed fun in the month ahead!
