- -teaching example: the BIG 36- top 36 multiplication questions practiced being completed in 3 minutes





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- teaching example: Spiralized Writing- students continually use a writing style through the year on a weekly basis vs. For a few weeks period. (e.g., Communication Writing on Tuesdays, Building a Story Thursdays)
- personalized interventions to aid in learning
- All our Montessori Material is in use, and we are purchasing more, and we are linking the material to the new curriculum
- HAGGERTY and UFLI (teaching resources) are showing rave results (Phonics based reading)
- Parent Question Period: Are parents aware if their child is receiving an intervention? YES, absolutely they are a part of the growth
- Priority 2- Inclusions –Covid times shared results that come off negative but to the children the experience was at times (NO Library, NO sibling hugs, NO Clubs, NO Concerts, NO Malt, NO shared classroom)
- Ensuring we have effective use of social media for communication

7.0 Trustee's Report- Andre Ouellette, Trustee Liaison

- Last Board meeting was Dec 13
- 158 students attended the last Reading University; Financial support provided \$200/student and has been requested to increase to \$260/student for next year; Grade 3's moving to Grade 4
- Parents concern over class sizes and requesting smaller; attendance is up, talking with Alberta Education for solutions
- 23 Ukrainian students in the district, \$5500/student funded, and a report is being built on the dollar usage
- Nutrition program in the schools-makes 800 lunches per week
- Next Student Advisory Meeting is in Feb- 17 students and 3 trustees (Rob Martin, Chris Johnson, Andre Ouellette)
- Focused on the priority outcomes at each of the 18 schools in the district over the 3-year plan
- Next board meeting Jan 10/23
- Strut and strive Fashion show coming March 18 at the Composite High School
- Blanket Exercise for Parents (Search for media links to share)
- March 9/23 Bomb Scare, RCMP responded, and it was deemed false, administration teams took everything seriously to ensure safety, previous USA number as before
