
Parkside Montessori School Council meets the <u>first</u> Monday of each month in-person at Parkside Montessori at 6pm.


The Parkside Montessori School Council is hosting a Blanket Exercise on Tuesday, Feb. 27th, 6:30-8:30pm

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#### Casa dei Bambini, Preschool & Kindergarten

January was a bustling and learning-filled month in the Casa dei Bambini classes! It was wonderful to see everyone return refreshed after the holidays and it felt great getting to spend time reviewing our routines and getting back into the swing of things. Our students were very eager to begin classroom jobs this month! We spent time talking about the added responsibility of taking on a classroom job, and decided together with the children which jobs would be important in our classes. Our students have been doing a fantastic job of carrying out their jobs with dedication and zeal – it is exciting to see them take ownership of these care of the environment tasks and to show such pride in our shared environment.

January was also the month of the dinosaur in the Casa classrooms! This was an area that we knew we absolutely had to hone in on as most of our students had expressed an interest and curiosity to know more about dinosaurs and the period in which they lived. The student engagement connected to our dinosaur theme has been incredible and we will still be exploring some dinosaur-related paths into February as we follow our students' curiosity.

In February we are also looking forward to learning all about Lunar New Year! As it is the Year of the Dragon, we hope to delve into some dragon art, learn about the Chinese New Year Dragon Dance, learn about, and prepare traditional red envelopes as gifts and to enjoy some delicious food in celebration. February is also a month to celebrate kindness at Parkside Montessori. We will be taking part in Community Kindness Week along with beginning our very own Casa kindness initiative that we hope will have a great impact on our students and the community!

In Language Arts this month, all students will be working on printing their name with just one capital letter at the beginning. Some of our students are getting into their writing work! Working on practical writing tasks at home is a terrific way to get Casa kids to write. For example, you could invite your child to help to make the grocery list, plan meals and make a menu, or make a card for someone special! In Math, we are working with all our students on the Counting Principles. Counting at home is a terrific way to support this process. Counting forwards and backwards from 1-10 and 10-1 is a great start. Counting starting anywhere between 1-10 (for example from 4-10 or 8-1) is also an important skill to practice. It is amazing to see the students develop these integral numeracy skills!

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# Lower Elementary, Gr. 1, 2, 3

Hello Parkside families,

We have been off to a great start to 2024 in the lower elementary Montessori classrooms. The students settled in nicely after the winter break and have been setting and reaching new goals during our work block periods.

In Math, the children continue to work on strengthening their understanding of place value using numbers that are becoming larger as the year goes on. The Montessori colour coded system helps students create a strong foundation to build, compare, and order numbers. With this understanding they can regroup numbers to add, subtract, multiply and divide. In each ELMO class, we are also focusing on other math concepts, such as time, graphing and geometry.

In Language Arts, the children continue to build on their understanding of the sounds that groups of letters make through their daily phonics lessons. This knowledge allows students to blend and segment sounds to read and write new words. They are also building a bank of words that they can quickly identify and can write using conventional spelling. These are often words that do not follow aeneral phonetic rules and that they must learn "by heart." Several ELMO classes have also been developing their letter writing skills. The students have been very excited to share their letters back and forth with each other, and to write important messages to their loved ones at home and in the community.

In Social Studies, each of the classes have been studying a community in Canada. The students are learning about details such as the landscape, climate, economy, history, and recreational activities of the people who live in these communities. Art classes have been a fun way for us to integrate our learning on these communities. Mr. Josh's class made beautiful lighthouses last week after studying Meteghan, Nova Scotia.

In Science, our classes took an exciting trip to the Phillip J. Currie Dinosaur museum! For many of the students, this was their first trip on a school bus and the excitement in the air was palpable. When we got to the museum, we received a guided tour, completed a scavenger hunt, met the museum's pet tortoise and pet snake, watched a dino movie, and took part in an activity focused on the timeline of life on Earth. This important learning relates directly to our Montessori work with The Great Lessons. The hands-on activity allowed for a stronger understanding of the monumental length of time on Earth before the arrival of humans. Students could also build on our previous work on the classification of animals as they placed examples of each along the fabric continuum of time

January was a busy month, and we are looking forward to all of the fun and learning that February holds!

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# Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Greetings from the Upper ELMO team!

We have had a wonderful start to the 2024 year in upper elementary. Students have been settling back into their routines and helping one another with our classroom expectations and transitions throughout the day. We survived a couple of weeks of inside recess and the kids have been enjoying the nice weather as of late – especially in their outside time for P.E. with Mr. Monty.

In Math, students continued exploring, extending, and describing various sequences. They can determine if the sequence is arithmetic (adding or subtracting) or if it is geometric (multiplying or dividing). They have also worked with statistics with creating their own surveys and analyzing data. Using that data, they have and will continue to interpret and display it in different graphs and charts!

In Language, students are exploring various editing tools and how to give and receive feedback as they work on narratives. They are working on writing a draft, revising, and writing an additional draft before publishing. A highlight in the month was Literacy Week – the guest readers, read around the school and Starbooks were all a huge success! Dressing up as a book character was also a highlight of that week and many students had fun with bringing their favourite character to life!

Grade 6 has begun to work on coding and exploring NASA's space jam. In Social Studies, they are learning about the Iroquois Confederacy. Grade 5 has been continued building their mini library, listening to stories of Indigenous, Vikings, English, and French roles in the history of Canada. They also continue to study weather in Grade 5 Science. Grade 4 has been learning about the various uses of the buffalo and the history of Alberta. In Science, they are exploring gravity, magnetism, and electrostatic force.

In Art, we focused on fabric arts and weaving paper dragons for Lunar New Year – Year of the Dragon. If you have an interest and want to lead a small group in knitting, crocheting or other fab-

ric arts please let us know! In Music, we have started ukuleles and learning more about musical theory on days that they are not playing the instruments. We have started with picking open strings and just started learning strumming with easy chords.


