Hello, ELMO 123 Families,

We hope everyone had a wonderful Easter break and returned ready to learn.

March was a fun and busy month! The highlight of it being our second Celebration of Learning of the school year. It was truly special to witness our students leading the way in showcasing their achievements in learning. We were thrilled to have families join us to see the incredible progress our students have been making!

Our Lower ELMO classes are hard at work investigating our new Alberta Science Curriculum. Each class is working on a different aspect of the curriculum this month. The units we are investigating are Energy, Matter, Living Systems, and Computer Science. Within each of these units we are continuing to learn about Scientific Investigation. One highlight of Science learning comes from Miss Jen's class who have been building their own dream houses which connect with their learning about Matter.

In Social Studies, students are exploring how life in Iqaluit differs from life in Grande Prairie. They are discovering fascinating facts that explain the differences and are also learning about how our community compares to where Inuit people live. A highlight from this learning is how Miss Jennifer's class extended their learning with a fun permafrost experiment which connects to learning that in Nunavut, there is permafrost under the ground.

In Math, our Lower ELMO classes will continue learning about geometry, fractions, four operations and measurement.

MONTESSORI NEWS

Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Greetings from the Upper ELMO team!

March has been an extremely busy month for our students. We had many special days such as Twin Day and Plaid Day as well as MALT and our annual Egg Hunt. March is such a special time because we get to have our second Celebration of Learning. It is so wonderful getting to visit with all our families and share the amazing learning going on in our classrooms.

Students were excited to walk to the Montrose Cultural Centre, Library and Health Unit. We were able to expand our art learning with a special exhibit about weaving that involved art from many different cultures and had a specific focus on First Nations weaving. We hope you were able to see them in our hallway at the Celebration of Learning! A highlight of the trip was the engaging presentations at the health unit. Students loved learning about sun safety, dental hygiene, and hand washing. Thank you to all the parents who joined us and made this trip possible.

In Math, students wrapped up their study of algebra and began working on geometry. Math concepts of symmetry, congruency and tessellation have been very engaging for the students and they have enjoyed seeing the connection between math and art. It is a favourite unit for many as they can connect their learning all the way from Casa to geometrical concepts being studied in Upper ELMO!

In Language, students have been working hard with Montessori Grammar and Word Study materials. These special materials help students understand parts of speech and build valuable spelling and vocabulary skills. Students continue to work in small groups on both writing and reading.

Music students are wrapping up their ukelele lessons and composer studies. They are already starting to practice for the spring concert. In Art, students have finished up weaving for now and are working with digital art as well as symmetry and tessellation projects to tie into Math! Digital art is always a special favourite and gives the students a chance to work with our collection of digital cameras.

Grade 6 students have really loved building their coding knowledge using the Sphero robots. They have also been learning about energy and forces. Building a simple catapult let them explore spring force. Grade 5 students completed their weather and climate projects and have started coding on the Tynker website and exploring the moon! Grade 4 students have wrapped up our Non-Contact Forces unit and have begun our unit about Space. In Social Studies Grade 6 students have begun to prepare for the Provincial Achievement Test. This may seem early but practicing with questions and building study skills will help them to feel ready for this test. They are also learning about Canadian government structures. Grade 5 students have completed their mini library project which were displayed in the library for families to see during the Celebration of Learning. They have now begun a self-paced murder mystery that is set on the Canadian railway! Grade 4 students continue learning about the Stories and Histories of the People of Alberta and are currently making mini books on The Fur Trade, The Métis Culture, and the Hudson's Bay Company. Students are using research skills and nonfiction writing skills to create mini books.
