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Lower Elementary, Gr. 1, 2, 3

Hello from the ELMO123 Team!

This year has flown by. It is hard to believe that it is already June. It has been amazing to watch all the students grow over the past year. We are looking forward to spending the last few weeks with the students. We have many exciting learning opportunities coming up!

As part of our Science unit on how plants and animals grow, each ELMO 1,2,3 class has received an army of caterpillars. This will provide students with the opportunity to witness a life cycle firsthand as the caterpillars grow, create their chrysalises, and become butterflies. We will then release them back into our school environment so that they can continue the lifecycle.

As part of our Social Studies curriculum, we made a visit to the Stompede. This introduced students to local traditions and activities. During this field trip, students participated in "Classroom in the Dirt". This program included activities such as roping, wagon rides, mini pony demonstration, trick riding demonstration, Animal Care program and the famous Ricky Ticky also joined us for some entertainment and knowledge.

We have also been very fortunate to continue our Grand Buddies program. Some of our ELMO 1,2,3 classes visited the Care Center in May, and the remaining classes have their visits scheduled for June. This program provides the students with the chance to visit with our Grand Buddies while completing crafts and singing songs. Please check communication from your child's teacher with information about future visits.

The weather is getting warmer, and we are trying to spend more time outside. Please ensure that your students are wearing sunglasses and hats to protect them from the sun. They can also bring sunscreen to put on before gym and recess. If they are wearing sandals or Crocs, please make sure that they pack an extra pair of running shoes to change into for gym.

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Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Greetings from the Upper ELMO team! It's so hard to believe that May is already over, and we are into our final month of the school year.

The track meet at the end of May was a huge highlight with fantastic participation from our Grade 5 and 6 students. They showed great sportsmanship and positive Parkside pride!

In Math, students continued to expand their geometry understanding as they explored measurement concepts. Determining both perimeter and area are main skills for Grade 4 and 5; with Grade 6 determining volume as well. While the older students attended the track meet, Grade 4 was inspired by our recent Playground Opening Ceremony to design and label the perimeter and area of their own playground design.

In Language, students continue to deepen accuracy and comprehension skills in reading as we fit in a few more reading groups and book studies to finish the school year. With a connection to cultural storytelling, many students created their own 'pourquoi tale' - a piece of writing that can creatively explain the reason why something is the way it is. Going through the writing process takes time and requires stamina to plan, draft, edit, revise and publish one piece.

In Music, students performed three ukulele pieces at the Spring concert and have moved onto percussion. We were so fortunate to borrow authentic Indigenous drums from Elder Theresa and learn a welcome song that our school's Cree Club performed at the Playground Opening Ceremony. We will continue to try other percussion activities including bucket drumming and Orff instruments.

In Art, students learned about using perspective to add depth to their drawings. They also enjoyed learn-

ing about how math concepts such as tessellation and symmetry are used to create beautiful art.

In Grade 4 Science, students have begun a Space flip book, which is a fun way to deepen their understanding of several aspects of space, including how we view space, the vastness of the universe, constellations, and the how stars are used in navigation. In Grade 4 Social Studies, students have completed their "Stories and Histories" mini-book and will be beginning our final unit which is "Alberta: Celebrations and Challenges".

In Grade 5 Science, students shared their amazingly creative and informational body system projects and explore Coding concepts. In Grade 5 Social Studies, students have begun to explore the major events from the time of Canadian Confederation until present day. In Grade 6, students enjoyed a special Science field trip, Walk Through the Forest, to a local forestry area where they learned all about local forests and eco systems. Students are especially enjoying learning how drones assist in forestry and fire fighting efforts. For Social Studies, Grade 6 students learned about local government and worked on reviewing for the upcoming Provincial Achievement Test.

We have a lot on the go to end the year, so please do not hesitate to reach out if you have any questions about classroom activities & assignments. It's going to be a wonderful June!



Persons with a valid Disability Tax Credit certificate and children under 18 will be able to apply online beginning June 1, 2024. All remaining eligible Canadian residents can apply in 2025.






Alberta Health Services is proud to offer FREE online programming to caregivers of school-age children and youth as well as adults in the community who want to learn more about addiction and mental health topics.
