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# October News

The leaves of green have changed and the brilliant colors of yellow, red, and orange can be seen all around us! The familiar sounds of rustling and crunching leaves remind us that Fall has arrived. Our staff and students have settled into the 2024-2025 school year. Thank you for partnering with us on our nineth September as a school community!

September is a time for reviewing expectations, routines, and for building our school community. This year we hosted our first Leadership Academy. Each day for 9 days, children at Parkside explored learning different leadership skills and skills for interacting successfully with others. We also had our annual Color Days which were a time to review the Zones of Regulation and continue building our skills for self-regulation.

Each fall we spend time determining our students' areas of strength and areas for growth to enable us to plan for each child at their current level of achievement. Classroom teachers are completing formative assessments to guide their planning to ensure that instruction and learning are taraeted to best address each student's individual needs. Parkside teachers are engaged in continual learning and improvement to ensure that we are providing the best learning for each child. Montessori materials have come out, creating a busy and exciting learning environment at Parkside! The children of Parkside also put together a beautiful art display to honor the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Many Parkside families were able to come to the school and complete an "Art Walk" and view the artwork. Each classroom has spent time this month talking about the role that we all play and our school efforts to support truth and reconciliation.

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Coming up in October we will have our annual Fall Read-A-Thon. This fundraiser has 100% of funds collected going to the children of Parkside. Funds are used for school purchases such as sporting events, school fun days, and special presentations (i.e., Telus World of Science Presentations, Alberta Musical Theatre Company, author, artist, musician visits, artist in residence, etc.), Practical Life materials and activities, M.A.L.T. materials, special craft and art materials, specialized PE equipment, student choice Library books, field trips, etc.) Student packages will come out the second week of October. We are looking forward to focusing on our reading and fundraising at the same time!

It is important to us that we engage meaningfully with parents. Our School Council is one way that you can participate in offering feedback and learning about our school. Meetings are the first Monday of the month at 6:00 pm at Parkside. Another way that you can be involved in our school community is by participating in the Fundraising Guild. The Fundraising Guild also meets the first Monday of the month at 7:15. Thank you to the executive of both the School Council and The Fundraising Guild of Parkside Montessori for supporting our students and school community in their roles.

We spent time talking about the Zones of Regulation and our feelings - practicing identifying how we feel and naming our feelings towards self-awareness and to communicate and share our feelings with others. We also brainstormed ideas on ways to calm down and feel better to get back into the Green Zone.

Our students have been learning and working purposefully, taking important Montessori practices to heart such as how to use and roll up a mat, how to carry and properly handle materials, how to walk in a line, and how to treat one another with grace and courtesy. We will focus on these and other foundational skills towards normalization throughout the school year.

We are so glad it's October and have lots of exciting and engaging work ahead of us. We hope to take full advantage of this beautiful season and explore apples and the falling leaves. We plan on getting outdoors lots to observe the changes in the season firsthand. We also hope to bring the outdoors into our classrooms for further study, continued hands-on learning and to inspire us in the work we do. 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## Lower Elementary, Gr. 1, 2, 3



Hello from the ELMO123 Team,

The first month has flown by. It is hard to believe that it is already October. We have had many exciting learning opportunities, and we have many more to come this month.

We spent a great deal of time in September working towards normalization of our classrooms. In Montessori education, this term refers to the creation of a respectful and joyful learning environment where students complete activities with full concentration and independence. This is an important step in the development of a safe and caring classroom, where each child can feel successful working at their own pace.

One way that we helped to foster normalization within the classroom was through our daily Social Emotional Learning and Zones of Regulation. Through Social Emotional Learning, students learned the importance of skills such as leadership, perseverance, and cooperation. Through the Zones of Regulation, students learned about the four zones and created a toolbox for getting to and remaining in the Green Zone. These lessons will continue throughout the year as needed by each individual classroom.

Another Important part of our Lower Elementary Montessori curriculum is The Five Great Lessons. These lessons are designed to awaken the students' curiosity and imagination. These broad lessons are told at the beginning of the year before students are introduced to more specific areas of study. These lessons include The First Great Lesson - Coming of the Universe and the Earth, The Second Great Lesson - Coming of Life, The Third Great Lesson - Coming of Human Beings, The Fourth Great Lesson - Communication in Signs, The Fifth Great Lesson - The Story of Numbers. All ELMO 123 classes have introduced the First & Second Great Lessons. The students will be listening to the remaining lessons in the coming weeks.

The weather can change quite drastically throughout the day. It is a good idea to ensure that students are dressed in layers that they can easily add or remove if necessary. Mr. Monty will also be taking students outside for Physical Education on occasion. If students wear Crocs, sandals or rubber boots it is a good idea to have them bring an extra pair of outdoor shoes for gym.

## Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Hello 456 Families,

We are making new connections and strengthening existing ones as students settle into the four sections of Upper ELMO. Normalization, becoming independent with the routines and expectations of our classrooms, has been the primary focus as we start the year together. Complete normalization is our ultimate goal students who are continually challenged to uphold the positive and respectful expectations we have set for work block, lunch, recess, and other learning times throughout our day. When students demonstrate that they are ready, all four homeroom teachers are excited to plan purposeful collaboration to happen so that students from various classrooms have the chance to work together in the 456 hallway!

In Language, we have begun looping various forms of writing throughout the week and will continue this all year instead of doing separate "units" of writing. Students will be able to build on their writing skills in all areas throughout the year and find specific types of writing to be their favourite – whether it be poetry, letter-writing, narratives, or functional writing tasks, we are excited to see what our authors create this year! Students will go through the writing process of plan, draft, revise, edit and publish many times this year and have already given pieces of their writing to their teachers to guide instruction! Regular library visits and use begin in October as guided reading groups and individual novel studies are beginning.

In Math, we have started the year with a review of place value and strategies for the four operations; addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. This work continues all year as students move from using concrete Montessori materials to more abstract pencil and paper algorithms. In October we will expand student knowledge of number as they connect the decimal place value system to fractions and ratios, depending on their grade level. Our Grade 4 students have been exploring the clock and telling time. Be sure to quiz them and practice in your morning and evening routines.

For French, students are learning the basics. From numbers, colours, greetings and calendar - les élèves font très bien! (The students are doing well!). In Art, the theme has been drawing and soon we will explore other mediums such as watercolour an oil pastel. Music has focused on beat and rhythm; students will soon explore notation as they prepare for instrument work later this year!

This year for Science and Social Studies each ELMO456 teacher is responsible for their homeroom class. Miss Desiree, Miss Jackie, Miss Stefanie, and Miss Kristen get to have time every week to collaborate on planning and preparing engaging activities for Science and Social Studies topics. All students are starting with "Matter" in Science. Grade 4 and 5 will focus on Canadian history in Social Studies and Grade 6 will dive into democracy!

It has been a wonderful start to the year, and we are looking forward to some Fall and Halloween-themed fun in the month ahead!
