Accompanying the report card information will be a parent handbook that is designed to support understanding of the new GPPSD report card that will be in use this term. 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### Casa dei Bambini, Preschool & Kindergarten

The Casa classes had a busy and fun month of October. We spent time investigating pumpkins and talking about Halloween and Thanksgiving.

In November, we will be shifting our focus to the continents. The continents are a part of our Montessori Social Studies curriculum. We will be doing hands-on activities to learn about the continents. Our first continent will be North America. Each class will choose the next continent to study based on connections to our individual classrooms.

We will work on Practical Life Skills including pouring, tweezing, lacing, and tonging. Practical Life skills help our students with their fine motor, concentration, and attention.

In Language, we will be continuing to focus on phonemic awareness and letter recognition. Phonemic Awareness is the ability to focus on individual sounds in words. This includes rhyme, identification of beginning and ending sounds, syllable recognition, and compound words.

In Math, we will continue to focus on numbers to 10. We will also spend some time sorting and patterning.

In Science, we will be investigating objects using our 5 senses. The children will learn that our sense include smell, taste, touch, sound, and hearing. Our Sensorial materials provide an excellent opportunity to work on our senses.

We are looking forward to all of the learning that will take place in the month of November!

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# Lower Elementary, Gr. 1, 2, 3



Hello from the ELMO123 Team,

We have had a fantastic October in ELMO 123! Our busy month included the continuation of our Montessori Great Lessons, where we presented lessons three, four, and five. These lessons focused on humans on earth, writing and communication, and the development of numbers. These lessons leave a wonderful impression on students as we dive deeper into literacy and numeracy.

It has been exciting to see the progress students are making during our work blocks. Students are showing more independence in choosing activities during work block and are able to sustain focus for longer periods of time. During this time, students have been developing literacy and numeracy skills. Each day, we focus on helping students hear, identify, and manipulate sounds in words, while also enhancing their phonics skills for reading and writing.

In Math, students have been exploring patterns and deepening their understanding of numbers and place value through various Montessori materials.

In Social Studies, we have been learning about the Provinces and Territories of Canada, zooming in to take a closer look at Alberta. As we delve into Alberta, we will explore its landforms, bodies of water, climate, and natural resources.

In Science, students have begun their exploration of matter, focusing on the three states: solid, liquid, and gas. They are learning about both natural and processed materials and how they are created.

As the weather gets colder, please ensure your child comes to school dressed appropriately for winter. Please have your child practice putting on their snow gear independently at home. This allows your child to have the optimum amount of time outside getting fresh air and exercise.

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# Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Hello Families,

October was done in a blink – but we packed in some great learning and leadership tasks! For example, the 4,5,6 students worked very hard in planning, setting up and hosting fun Halloween centers or games for the younger students to end the month. We have also had a few different clubs led by different 4,5,6 students begin this fall including mini sticks, yo-yo club and Cree club! Parkside Montessori has started our own Destination Imagination club, where students can participate in critical thinking and creative challenges with their peers. Contact Miss Kristen if you think your child would be a good fit for this after-school learning extension!

In Math, we continued to focus on place value and the four operations. These important numeracy skills build the foundation for our learning all year. We also started working with fractions, decimals, ratios and percents. Seeing how these concepts work together and applying operations to those as well has been intriguing for many. We will continue all these numeracy-based concepts yearlong to build understanding and fluency. It is important to meet the child where they are in their learning and build on those successes over a longer span of time.

In Language, we have been able to continue small group and one on one conferencing with students to meet their reading and writing needs. Giving students timely feedback is an important part of ensuring they are growing in their Language work. In that feedback loop, students are figuring out what the specific things they need to work on are and will continue to revise and edit their work. We know they will have some favourite pieces of writing to share with you at the upcoming Celebration of Learning times!

Our Grade 4 and 5 students are learning about Matter with topics such as recycling, waste and hazardous materials in Science. In Social Studies, they are focusing on the history of Canada. The Grade 6 students are learning about various democratic principles and how they can connect to the Canadian Charter of Rights and

Freedoms. In Science, they are learning about Matter with topics such as changing states, particle theory and impact of temperature.

At this time of year, the students and teachers are busy assessing learning and reflecting on the first term in all subject areas. We would like to thank you for your continued support and engagement with your child's learning. Please continue to reach out to us to ask any questions you may have as Celebration of Learning and report cards approach.
