Casa dei Bambini, Preschool & Kindergarten

Happy December!

We are excited to welcome winter in our Casa classrooms and to begin our countdown to Christmas holidays. We've already begun practicing for our upcoming Christmas concert and can't wait to share songs and dances with you! November was a busy month filled with lots of wonderful learning. Students enjoyed beginning our continent study and learning more about North America. We are continuing this study as we spend time learning about the traditions of our own families, our cultures and our histories to share with classmates. Through sharing, we hope to deepen our connections within our classroom communities and to celebrate one another's unique identities and families.

In our Montessori environment, we spend much time encouraging independence. This means that we encourage students to get outdoor gear off and on, practice hand hygiene, prepare and clean up their snack, and to choose and carry out classroom work for which they have received presentation on their own. Our Practical Life shelves incorporate many activities that support this development as well as students practice pouring, scooping, and tweezing just to name a few. Casa dei Bambini students have made wonderful progress in this area in a few short months! Practicing these skills at home is another way to support your child's independence in these areas.

As we count down to Christmas holidays, Casa students are taking part in many activities that work to build number sense. We are practicing counting forwards, backwards, and even skip counting! Some of our winter and Christmas themed activities that encourage number sense require students to perform tasks such as connecting quantity to a numeral, subitizing—that is, to recognize how many are in a set without having to count, recognize and make patterns, and to problem solve.

In Language this month, along with continuing learning the letters and sound of the alphabet, we will be focusing on retelling stories and putting narratives into sequence. We will also continue playing rhyming games and taking on other fun activities that encourage phonological awareness.

We hope everyone has a lovely December and a joyful holiday season.

Hello from the ELMO123 Team,


November was a busy month at Parkside Montessori. We started the month with a beautiful Remembrance Day Assembly prepared by Mr. Josh and Miss Desiree's classes. Students did a wonderful job in this leadership role. ELMO 123 students have been demonstrating their knowledge and setting learning goals. Each class has been discussing and practicing using grace and courtesy in our community.

As we enter our new term, we have begun some new learning opportunities and curiosities. In Social Studies, we are finishing learning about Alberta's natural and political boundaries. Next, we will begin learning about government systems. In Science, we are finishing our unit on Matter including states of matter and exploring energy. In Math, we are focusing our understanding of number including place value, basic operations, and skip counting. We look forward to working on winter-themed Montessori activities including snowflake math and winter writing using the small environment. We will also be incorporating winter-themed Practical Life activities in the classroom with tasks such as tying, sewing and baking.

As we enter December with more snow and colder temperatures, please make sure your children are dressed appropriately for the weather and come in layers as we will be spending lots of time outside.

We are looking forward to seeing and sharing learning with families at our upcoming Celebration of Learning. Have a wonderful December!

Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Hello Families,

It seems like November was over in a flash and ended with so much building excitement for our first Celebration of Learning of the year. Your children have been busy reflecting on all of the hard work they have been doing in Math, Language and other subjects. We also enjoyed our real-life application of our Math curriculum (Fractions, Decimals and Percents) and the Language curriculum (writing, collaboration and communication) when we went on our bowling field trip!

Students have been giving and receiving peer feedback as they continue their writing in Language. Getting a peer to read and give feedback for what would make it flow better has been a strategy to improve our writing this month and will be an effective strategy moving forward in our multi-age classrooms! Some key teacher feedback that we have been giving is to make sure that students indent new paragraphs and that paragraphs should be around one main idea. You can support this work by having your child write at home. Take a fun event or a family activity that you have done and see how your child can arrange details and description to make the most of out paragraph.

In Math we wrapped up our introductory work on basic operations as well as fractions and decimals. As the year progresses, we will focus on other units in math such as algebra, sequencing and geometry while looping back to the more complex number concepts that were introduced in this first term. Since the learning outcomes that we focused on in math for term one are based on a year-long progression, your child will be continually challenged to increase his/her fluency and accuracy with the number concepts we will loop through. For these more complex concepts we have the goal of end-of-year

mastery versus beginning-of-the-year introductions, which you will see reflected in their report cards.

Grade 4 & 5 students have been continuing to explore forces in Science, such as contact and non-contact, push/pull, and gravity to name a few. With Grade 6 also starting to look into forces as well. In Social Studies, digging into the history of Canada and researching key people has been a big undertaking! Grade 6 students have been relating democracy to levels of government and/or other democracies around the world such as what democracy looks like with the Iroquois, Athenians, and Romans.
