

Casa dei Bambini, Preschool & Kindergarten

Happy New Year to all of our Casa families! We hope you had a fantastic break, and we are enjoying to getting back into the routine for the month of January.

In Language, we will continue to focus on phonemic awareness and letter sounds. We will also continue to have a letter of the day that we focus on. As more of our students are learning their sounds, they are beginning to practice blending sounds together. This starts at a basic level, using compound words in oral language. For example, students learn that fire and truck can be put together to make one word- firetruck. As students become proficient with blending words together, they start blending letter sounds. We do this orally, as well as with the moveable alphabet for those who are ready. We can put together the sounds c-a-t to make the word cat.

In Math, we are focusing on patterns. We will identify, extend, reproduce, and create patterns. We will use sounds, pictures, objects, symbols and actions to make our patterns.

In Science, we will focus on the movement of objects, humans and other animals. Students will learn that movement is a change in position as well as moving objects in a variety of ways.

We are looking forward to a fun month of learning in January!

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Lower Elementary, Gr. 1, 2, 3



Happy New Year!

We hope that everyone had a fun and restful holiday break. We are excited to be back together and continuing our learning adventures. December was filled with fun, hands-on learning opportunities. Our Lower ELMO classes have been working with and getting to know their Reading Buddies over the past few months. This helps to build a sense of community within our school. We are looking forward to completing more activities with our buddies in the new year!

In Science this month, we are starting our Energy unit and will be investigating how forces affect the movement of objects. Students will be applying their Science vocabulary in P.E. with Mr. Monty as well! In Social Studies, our students will begin to learn about how decisions are made in our province. Over the term we will simulate a similar decision-making process in our classrooms, i.e., voting. In Math, students will be starting a Geometry unit. In Language Arts, Grade 2 & 3 students are working on reading fluency through book clubs! Please check your weekly email for the skills being practiced in your child's classroom.

We will be monitoring the weather daily and school grounds conditions daily to spend as much time as possible outside for recess. Please ensure that your child is dressed in layers and winter foot wear. Having outdoor gear (i.e., gloves, mittens, hats, and more) labeled will help us reunite lost items with their owners if they are dropped outside, in the boot room or hallway. We are looking forward to another exciting month of learning!

Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Hello Families,

We have had a wonderful start to the 2025 year in Upper ELMO. Students have been settling back into their routines and helping one another with our classroom expectations and transitions throughout the day.

In Math, students will explore, extend and describe various sequences. They will be determining if the sequence is arithmetic (adding or subtracting) or if it is geometric (multiplying or dividing). They will also work with statistics by creating their own surveys and analyzing data. Using that data, they have and will continue to interpret and display it in different types of graphs and charts. This connects with many of our Language outcomes as students interview one another and work on public speaking skills to share their data!

In Language, we will focus on writing and reading many different genres. At the end of January is Literacy Week. To spark excitement we will review Fiction genres like fantasy or realistic storytelling, and Non-Fiction genres like biographies and informative texts. We hope to share book recommendations with one another and make meaningful connections to stories as the month goes on.

All students are starting the Space unit in Science and will get to explore the Science in Motion planetarium! In Social Studies, students are learning about the systems in Canada and around the world for how governments and communities work.

In Art, we are finishing up line drawing and will be starting a textile art unit. If you have any interest and want to lead a small group in knitting, crocheting, cross-stitch, embroidery, or other fabric arts, please let us know! In Music, we have started ukuleles and learning more about music theory on days that students are not playing the ukulele. We will start with picking open strings and then learn strumming with easy chords.
