Monty has been with the Division for 17+ years, most of which was substitute teaching, and full time with Parkside Montessori for 3+ years. Had a lot of experience with different school environments in Grande Prairie through his substitute work and was very grateful to have the opportunity to join the staff of Parkside Montessori. Thank you to School Council & the Fundraising Guild for the new school mats that were purchased this year. He has enjoyed doing the maze activity with students and plans to do it twice more this year. Council had the opportunity to participate in the "Maze" at a previous meeting. Just did a MALT day with students where they used flour to create juggling balls with inverted balloons.

Monty has developed "Not Yet" days which he will be presenting at Celebration of Learning as well as this year's Teacher Conference. It began with a student who felt very frustrated because they were trying to accomplish a skill that wasn't going their way. He introduced "Not Yet" Days where students can pick anything from basketball, floor hockey, to gymnastics and juggling - the only stipulation is it they must be working on a skill they can't do yet. "I love shooting baskets, but I can't shoot from this location – yet" "I can't shoot 2/3/4 baskets in a row - yet" other examples are hockey stick balancing, whiffle ball catching, headstands, etc. Not Yet Days allow students to utilize all kinds of equipment that are otherwise hard to bring into class as some only have <5 sets. He has also enjoyed observing how students must be aware of the space they're practicing in so as to not interfere with other students given the various activities that happen simultaneously. It has also given him the opportunity to expand his knowledge on skills not covered in the Phys Ed. curriculum (i.e. Gymnastics)

Parents in attendance affirmed hearing a lot about Not Yet Days and how this Social Emotional Learning reaches beyond Phys Ed. as students apply the approach to skills they can't quite accomplish yet at home. Parents discussed the fondness the children have for Monty & how many of us hear about games like Who Let the Dogs Out.

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#### 6.0 Principal's Report and Advising Opportunities

6.1 Miss Corrine and Miss Terra's monthly report

Remembrance Day assembly, school spirit day, 456 students had UofC engineers visit, was excellent & they were here for the whole day, wacky hair day, hold & secure day, MALT morning, there was an RCMP presence in the neighbourhood in mid Nov. and admin wanted to let parents know that if there's ever a potential safety risk to the school the RCMP will contact the school to initiate a lockdown. During their presence in Nov. they hadn't contacted the school as they didn't deem the risk to be at that level but School Admin elected to initiate a Hold & Secure protocol as an extra precaution.

Coming up in Dec. more hold & secure drills, tomorrow night is the ed foundation striving for excellence award presentation to acknowledge students from last year, report cards, hot lunch, 2 Christmas concerts, PJ day, movie day.

New divisional report card – learning outcomes will be written in a way that better describes what outcome is meant to achieve. Parent mini sessions on first night of Celebration of Learning on Montessori materials, reading materials, Not yet days, etc. (information is available in the email that went home to parents)

Admin would appreciate feedback on new layout of report card. What is better? What could be improved? Comment structure is one of the biggest changes. Admin feels they are much more user friendly.

#### 6.2 2023/24 PAT Results

Reviewed Provincial Achievement Test (PAT) results with parents in attendance.

2023-24 was the first year of full implementation for the new English Language Arts and Math. AB Ed decided that PATs would not be written in these subjects. 2023-24 was optional implementation of the new Science curriculum which Parkside participated in. Due to the optional implementation PAT was not written for Science, leaving Social Studies to be the only PAT written for the 2023-24 year. This year we will be writing all but Social Studies as we are participating in the optional pilot of the new Social curriculum.

We do not have a proper baseline of comparative data for PATs yet as we have had such small numbers of students writing tests. This makes comparing yearly data very challenging. We had 13 students write last year. We estimate it will take about 5 years post rollout of the new curriculum to really interpret trends.
