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Casa dei Bambini, Preschool & Kindergarten

Welcome February!

January was a busy and fun month in the Casa dei Bambini class-rooms. We spent some valuable time getting back into our daily routines and revisiting our expectations after Christmas holidays. We also had the opportunity to focus on our social emotional learning as we completed our Slumberkins lessons with the CONNCT team. Casa students had the chance to think about and discuss their feelings while making connections to the stories and characters in this interactive program as well to their peers as they engaged in these positive mental health practices. We hope to carry these practices and discussions forward with us for the remainder of the year and beyond.

In Math this month we will be focusing on identifying and creating repeating patterns. Patterns are things that repeat in predictable ways that we can observe to build mathematical thinking and learning. Being able to recognize and make patterns allows children to predict outcomes based on what they observe—an important skill in math and in life. Students will be encouraged to begin looking for patterns everywhere in our community and in nature. If you see a fantastic pattern with your child, please feel free to send along a picture (or nature artifact) to their teacher so that we can explore it in class. Similarly, if your child creates a pattern that they wish to share with their class, sent it along!

January was a wonderful month to focus on diversity in our community and to explore the different ways people in our community and around the world recognize and celebrate the new year. This work aligned well with our cultural geography focus as we shifted from North America to Asia. We delved into Lunar New Year and the children had a blast learning about important symbols of Lunar New Year and the Chinese Zodiac. Our students had fun finding out what zodiac year they were born in and the associated attributes this predicts. They also enjoyed making crafts for this year, the Year of the Snake. Everyone is looking forward to cooking a delicious feast in the Practical Life room which we will revel in by getting Casa 1 and Casa 2 together to celebrate. Throughout this learning, it has been wonderful to see our students embrace diverse cultures and celebrations. As we inquire deeper this month into the concept of cooperation and the notion that we can achieve much more together than we can on our own, we will continue to incorporate our cultural geography and our learning surrounding expressions of traditions, cultures, and histories. Another way that we will be exploring cooperation this month is through the lens of contribution as a part of our special whole-school initiative, Community Kindness Week. Casa classes will be taking part in giving back to our community as well as taking on some other Random Acts of Kindness challenges to life our community up this month.

Hello from the ELMO 1,2,3 Team!

Our classes have been enjoying our time visiting our Grand Buddies at the GP Care Centre. We really appreciate all our parent volunteers who make these visits possible. This month in Science we are learning about Force (push, pull, friction and gravity). Later this month we will be learning about municipal and provincial governments and the services they provide in Grande Prairie. We hope to get out into our community again to visit both municipal and provincial buildings. ELMO 1,2,3 classes are also learning about Geometry. Students have been investigating shapes and angles and will be building 3D shapes by relating to what they learn about 2D shapes.

We are so impressed with the effort students have put in working through the Universal Screeners in both literacy and numeracy. Each teacher has been reviewing the results and is using it to guide instruction, ensuing that we are planning and teaching targeted skills based on identified student needs.

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Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Hello Families,

Expectations are growing in all areas, and we are hopeful that leadership in our students will shine through! At this point in the school year, students are expected to be well-versed in the classroom routines and expectations for both academic and interpersonal skills. We are committed to providing support, guidance and scaffolding for them as well as keeping families updated on progress as the next few month comprise vital parts of the school year.

In Math, students continued working with both sequences and statistics. One interesting piece of knowledge that we explore was the Fibonacci sequence. It is a wonderous and beautiful pattern that is often found in nature. Ask your child to share some of the examples that we have discussed in class! Besides the current topics in Math, we are continually looping back through the 'Number' concepts we introduced in Term One. You will often find students working on the four operations, fractions or decimals when they are working independently or with their teacher during work block.

In Language, many students have chosen to engage in a writing contest through the Grande Prairie Public Library. The story topic is all about a 'Carnival' and has allowed students to focus on various literary elements such as describing their five senses, having an exciting hook, building suspense or showing character emotions instead of just telling them. Our teacher-team will continue to look for real-world opportunities to showcase our student writing. The contest factor has been a great motivator for many of our writers and they have been so encouraging and helpful in giving and receiving feedback.

Science was quite epic this past month as all of our Upper ELMO students had the opportunity to explore the Science in Motion Mobile Planetarium! Planets, the sun, constellations and galaxies; students were transported across time and space by our knowledgeable host Josh. We are wrapping up the Space unit with some fun 'Alien Passport' projects. Ask your child if they are researching the sun, moon or a planet! In Social Studies, we are expanding our understanding of historical and modern democracy—including the furth trade for Grade 4 & 5. All students played an interactive game to sort the three levels of government: municipal, provincial, and federal. Check it out at home HERE.

We are strumming away on ukuleles in music, learning the four basic chords. In Art, students are connecting some art projects to Literacy week and then diving into some hands-on textile projects. We look forward to sharing our Community Kindness projects with everyone in February!
