Hello from the ELMO 1,2,3 Team!

We hope everyone had a wonderful Spring break and are ready for an exciting season of learning!

March was a fun and busy month, with the highlight being our second Celebration of Learning of the school year. It was truly special to see our students take the lead in showcasing their achievements. We loved having families join us to witness the incredible progress our students have been making!

Our Lower ELMO classes are diving into the new Alberta Social Studies curriculum, focusing on Government Systems and Citizenship. As we explore the concept of citizenship, students will also learn about different cultures and belief systems, broadening their understanding of the diverse world around them.

In Language Arts, we are beginning an exciting unit on poetry! Poetry is a fantastic way to develop strong, descriptive writing skills. Students will analyze poems to identify key grammar elements such as nouns, verbs, and adjectives. They will also build fluency and expression by practicing poem recitations.

In Math, we are starting a unit on measurement. Students will compare object heights, use non-standard units, and work with rulers to develop essential measuring skills.

We look forward to another month of growth, curiosity, and learning!

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Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Hello from Upper ELMO!

March was all about wrapping up our learning from Term 2 into some fantastic projects and formal assessments to prepare for report cards. It was great to see so many families at our Celebration of Learning nights! If you did not get a chance to discuss your child's learning progress, we are more than happy to arrange a time to meet in April. As we transition to Term 3, we will make it our mission to excite students in hands-on projects and student-led activities to keep the zest for learning alive and well!

In Language, students will be working with their teachers and peers in various reading and writing tasks. We strive to have a balance each week of narrative and functional pieces. Narrative is related to story writing or fiction books; and functional is related to nonfiction books or communicating research, opinions, or facts within a written piece. Students have their favourite genres in which they tend to gravitate towards during independent work time. It is up to us, as their teachers, to inspire them to push their learning limits by reaching for the other genres in both reading and writing so that they become well-rounded in Language!

In Math, students have really enjoyed solving the 'mysteries' that are inherent to algebra and order of operations! We will be exploring all things geometry to finish off the year! We will work with Montessori materials to build students' understanding with geometric concepts, such as angles, symmetry, and polygons to start. As mentioned last month, another focus that the school has been working on is to develop fact fluency (speed & accuracy) with basic facts! We have been able to practice both multiplication and division facts up to and including 12x12 within our classes, with our reading buddies and even as a whole school. It has been so great, and we hope to keep the momentum going!

In Science, we are learning about how the Earth is made up of four spheres (or systems). Each one is important: atmosphere, lithosphere, hydrosphere, and biosphere. This unit is similar to Dr. Montessori's Cosmic Education about how we are all interconnected, and we have a responsibility to our Earth! In Social Studies,

we have registered our classes for 'Canada Votes' and will be simulating civic participation. In Art, Grade 4s will apply several elements of art into hands on art projects such as clay paintings. Grade 5s will continue working on basket weaving. Grades 6s will be perfecting their embroidery skills! In Music, all students have just begun learning about different types of percussion instruments!

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Has your child had their annual eye exam? It's important to do before they start school!

Eye See...Eye Learn™

is a program that provides kindergarten-aged students with a comprehensive eye exam from an optometrist. There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19. If required, kindergarten-aged students also receive a free pair of eyeglasses.

How kindergarten-aged students participate

Step 1 Parents can find a participating optometrist at optometrists.ab.ca. Click on Find an Optometrist and Eye See...Eye Learn™, then enter your postal code to find a doctor close to you. Call and book an appointment.

Step 2 See your optometrist for the eye exam. Have your health card ready. There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19.

Step 3 If required, kindergarten-aged students will receive a free pair of eyeglasses. Ask to see the frame selection available. The optometrist will order your glasses for you.

*Free glasses are covered by a one year manufacturer's warranty.

Who can participate?

Eye See...Eye Learn is available to all **kindergarten-aged students** in Alberta. It's important to address eye health and vision problems before children begin school.

Children are eligible from August until they begin grade one.



There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19. It's a painless, non-invasive process that could change their lives!

Did you know?

- · 80% of learning is visual.
- 1 in 4 school-aged children has a vision problem.
- An eye exam detects health problems such as crossed eyes or lazy eye.
- Children with vision problems are often misdiagnosed as having learning or behavioural disabilities.
- The earlier an eye health or visual problem is identified, the more likely it can be corrected.
- Children often don't know they have a vision problem, as they believe what they are seeing is normal.
- It is not uncommon for parents to believe they would know if their child has a vision problem, because these issues can be hard to spot particularly if there is a problem in only one of the eyes.

What is an optometrist?

Your optometrist (doctor of optometry) is a primary source for all your vision, eye health and eyewear needs. They have the knowledge, tools and equipment necessary to diagnose, treat, prescribe medications or refer to a specialist, if needed.



How well can your child see?

You can't see the world through your child's eyes, but your optometrist can. During your child's eye exam, your optometrist will assess:

- · Visual acuity (how well they can see)
- Lazy eye, crossed eyes
- · Nearsightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism
- Colour vision
- · Eye coordination, tracking and depth perception
- Eye health






































Caregiver Education Team Newsletter April 2025
