Hello from Upper ELMO!

Greetings from the Upper ELMO team! Everyone returned from Spring Break well rested and ready to learn. The annual Egg hunt was a hit. Students were excited to participate in a student election and participate in the last MALT of the year.

In April, our focus in Math was all things geometry, algebra, and measurement. Students have been learning all about symmetry and tessellations. As we move into May, we will be reviewing the main concepts from earlier in the year and preparing our grade 6 students to write the Provincial Achievement Tests.

In Language, students continue to build their reading and writing skills. Students are really focusing on building paragraphs and short stories. They are diving into digital resources and creating podcasts, news broadcasts and digital magazines. Students enjoy learning about non-fiction text features.

In Social Studies, students have been learning about government systems. The federal election has been an interesting current event that has sparked many discussions. Miss Kristen's students organized a polling station and led everyone in a mock election to learn about how to vote.

In Science students have completed their sky science. Miss Jackie's class made models of the solar system and Miss Desiree's used Scratch coding to create digital models of celestial objects. Miss Stefanie's students made alien passports for either the Sun, our moon or a planet depending on grade level. Moving forward, students will be learning all about Earth systems and the geosphere.

Art students are continuing with symmetry, tessellation, and digital art. The grade 5 students have been working on sculpture and enjoyed being in the kitchen to build edible sculptures.
