6.1 Miss Corrine and Miss Terra's monthly report

Upcoming May – Telus coding camp for every afternoon for an hour this week. Headed to city hall, prov building and library, casa to firehall and library, 456 forest walk & historic Dunvegan, continuing fire & evac, hats on for mental health, 3d tournament coming up – 40 kids participating, Saturday from 10-3 Pax Den market. Duct tape day is coming up. PL day, school spirit day assembly, western day, part A of language arts exam, Casa kinder graduate photos, patrollers going on a swim day. Assurance Survey overall had school scoring higher than last year with close to the same number of respondents.

Staffing ongoing for next year – just have to hire Miss Stephanie's mat leave. Miss Julianne is receiving the staff award for Exemplary Service for 2024-2025

Desiree was nominated by Parkside Admin & awarded the parent of distinction with the Alberta School Council Association. The award was acknowledged during the ASCA Conference online and an assembly will take place to present this in the near future. 7.0 Trustee's Report- Joan Nellis, Trustee Liaison

The annual employee wellness report was received recently. This one was on staff wellness programs. Provided info to the board/assurance feedback that the board is committed to wellness, what it is doing and what some of the strategies are. 9 elements of wellness were reviewed (highlights), division vs. employee roles in wellness decision making.

April 11 had the pleasure of announcing that the comp received funding for 450 more students and 18 more classrooms. 3 story expansion will take place on west side of building. Career pathways – choose your own adventure. Framework that emphasizes interconnectedness from K-12, discovering interests and how to make a career from the interests. Operations are doing engagement with students, families, and local economy, to see what that looks like and what we need to move. This is done in partnership with NWP.

Summer school for high school students. Condensed courses that students can check off their list for more flexible programming during the standard school year. Calm & Phys Ed are popular ones that students will do through summer.

Teacher bursary program, 60 applicants received from students & graduates. 4 were awarded contracts and a \$5k bursary. 3 more will be awarded this year.

Edwin Parr nomination available to board, it has not given every year but they're excited to announce that Ali Estrada (Hillside Gr. 5 teacher), will be nominated by GPPSD.

Jordan's Principal is a human rights principle established by the Canadian Human Rights Tribunal (CHRT) to make sure that First Nations children do not face gaps, delays, or denials in accessing government services because of their identity as First Nations children. Families receive funding for children that need assistance in the classroom. Government is changing the funding. Nationally the program had been misused so fence posts have been installed. For GP public it means that 56 EAs whose funding comes from JP, will not be renewed for 2025/26.

At the last meeting we reviewed what prov budget meant for us. Had a full day meeting re budget recently but the first draft is not yet out. Budget has increased by 4%. 75% of the funding goes directly to staffing. Surplus is proportionate to district growth.
